For those who choose to incorporate alcohol into their lives, wine, beer and spirits in moderation can contribute to a healthy lifestyle. To explain the Canyon Ranch philosophy on wine, we must first explain our food philosophy:

Our aim is to nourish our guests through unique food experiences that feature clean, wholesome, seasonal, fresh ingredients, with an emphasis on local, organic and sustainable farming methods. We expertly prepare these foods to complement and enhance the natural beauty of the ingredients in order to create bright, vibrant and focused flavors with multiple textures, visual appeal, enticing aroma and superior nutritional value.

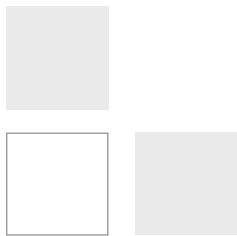
Why, then, should our wine philosophy be radically different than our food philosophy? The simple answer is that it's not. We have chosen wines for our list that compliment our light, flavorful cuisine. All are of the highest quality, and showcase clean and healthy ingredients and environmentally friendly farming methods. You can feel good about enjoying these wines.

Here are the three types we offer:

Organic – The USDA definition of “organic,” as applied to wines, is “a wine made from organically grown grapes and without any added sulfites.” The vast majority of wines made from organically grown grapes do not meet this standard, since sulfite-free wines have a very short shelf life and are prone to “off” flavors. Most people in the industry consider organic wines to be those made with organically grown grapes – fruit grown strictly without the use of pesticides or industrial fertilizers – and that’s the case with the wines identified as organic on our list.

Biodynamic – Biodynamic farming is an “ultra-organic” farming practice that takes into consideration the vineyard’s natural surroundings and revives ancient farming practices. It focuses above all on the health of the soil, and gives farmers the tools to create an ecosystem that permits all living things to exist comfortably with one another. Biodynamic farming, which originated as a modern movement in France, is a holistic system that moves according to ancient rhythms, taking into account even the phases of the moon. As in organic farming, the use of pesticides and industrial fertilizers is strictly prohibited.

Sustainable Wines – Sustainable winegrowing practices help reduce water and energy use, minimize pesticide use, build healthy soil, protect air and water quality, recycle natural resources, maintain surrounding wildlife habitat, provide employee education, and foster communication with neighbors about vineyard and winery operations. While not as strict as the rules governing the production of organic and biodynamic wines, sustainable practices guide operations that are more eco-friendly than conventional modern wine production. An increasing number of Napa Valley wines are designated sustainable by the Napa Valley Vintners Association, and many from the Northwest are designated “salmon-safe,” meaning that the vineyard’s runoff does not pollute local salmon habitats.



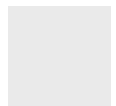
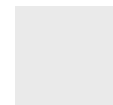
